- On the blue sheet... Get details on the **2007 summer session for Gwinnett County Online Campus**, including a course list and FAQs.

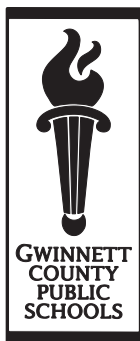
Registration for both face-to-face Summer School and Online Campus will be **online**.

- **Face-to-face Summer School online registration:** May 1–June 8, with in-person registration at Meadowcreek HS on June 9. (See the yellow sheet for details.)
- **Online Campus online registration:** May 1–June 6. In-person registration is **NOT** available for Online Campus classes. (See the blue sheet for details.)

### ***Important notes for summer school and Online Campus students...***

- Transportation is not provided for face-to-face summer school classes or for the face-to-face sessions required for Online Campus courses.
- A student should take no more than two summer classes: two face-to-face classes, two online classes, or a combination.
- All tuition fees are due at the time of registration.



# Gwinnett County Public Schools 2007 High School Summer School

Gwinnett County Public Schools' 2007 High School Summer School is a fee-based program that allows students to take courses to get ahead or to make-up a class previously failed. Courses are open to high school students, including selected courses for rising 9th graders. However, **transportation is not provided**. Your counselor will review your choices after you submit your summer school selections online. See frequently asked questions and answers below and a list of course offerings on the other side of this flyer. **For additional questions, ask your counselor or see the website.**

## Frequently Asked Questions About Summer School

### Where are summer school classes held?

A range of classes are available at three locations. Students may attend any summer school site that offers the course(s) needed.

- **Meadowcreek HS** (4455 Steve Reynolds Blvd., Norcross)
- **Mill Creek HS** (4400 Braselton Hwy./Hwy. 124, Hoschton)
- **South Gwinnett HS** (2288 E. Main St., Snellville)

### How much do summer school classes cost?

Each single-semester class costs **\$205** for Gwinnett County residents. Out-of-county residents pay **\$250** for each single-semester class. (Out-of-county residents must register in-person at Meadowcreek HS on June 9.)

### How do I register and pay for summer school?

For Gwinnett residents paying by credit card (VISA/Mastercard) or debit card, online registration will be held **May 1–June 8**. Register online at [www.gwinnettk12online.net](http://www.gwinnettk12online.net).

Gwinnett students paying by cash or money order and out-of-county residents register on **June 9** at Meadowcreek HS between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. **NOTE:** No personal checks will be accepted for summer school fees. Free/reduced tuition is not available. All tuition fees are due at registration.

### What are the dates for summer school ?

**May 1–June 8** Online registration (credit card, debit card)

**June 9** In-person registration, Meadowcreek HS (cash, money order, and all out-of-county students)

**June 13** FIRST DAY OF CLASS

**June 28** Progress reports issued

**July 4** Holiday

**July 10–13** State's End-of-Course Test window, selected courses

**July 17** Final exams/LAST DAY OF CLASS

**July 18** Summer Graduation Ceremony, Gwinnett Arena, 10 a.m.

### What days and hours do summer school classes meet?

Summer classes meet Monday through Friday. Class hours are:

**1st period** 7:30–10:30 a.m.

**Lunch** 10:30–11 a.m.

**2nd period** 11:05 a.m.–2:05 p.m.

### What is the attendance policy for summer school?

Because of the length of the class period (three hours) and the shortness of the summer school semester (24 days), students are required to attend class for a minimum of 22 days in order to meet the high school accreditation standards. Therefore, a student may miss no more than two days of summer school.

A third absence will result in the student's withdrawal with no refund. All absences (excused and unexcused) count toward attendance. No exceptions will be made. **Note:** Tardiness affects learning and is disruptive to the class. See consequences below:

**Late to class** (after the bell rings, in the first 30 minutes)=1 tardy  
**3 tardies**=1 absence

**Late to class** (more than 30 minutes)=1 absence

**3 absences**=Withdrawal from summer school (no refund)

### Is lunch served in the cafeteria during summer school?

The school cafeteria does not sell lunch during summer school. However, vendors sell lunch items (pizza, chicken sandwiches, etc.) to students during the half-hour lunch break. Students also may bring their lunch from home. **Students on campus for both 1st and 2nd period classes may not leave campus between classes for any reason. Leaving campus will result in a one-day suspension (an absence for attendance purposes).**

### What about final exams and other tests?

Students enrolled in the second semester of these courses—9th or 11th grade Language Arts, Algebra I, Geometry, Biology, Economics, and U.S. History—must take the state-mandated End-of-Course Test (EOCT) in that subject. Set for July 10–13, EOCTs count for 15% of the student's final grade.

**All students must take final exams**, no exemptions. Finals are scheduled for July 17, following the schedule below:

**1st period exam** 7:30–9:30 a.m.

**Break** 9:30–9:45 a.m.

**2nd period exam** 9:45–11:45 a.m.

Final exams count 20% of the total grade. An exception: For students who take EOCTs, the final exam counts 5% of the final grade and the EOCT counts 15% for a total of 20%.

- All courses are single-semester classes— equal to a .5 unit of credit— unless otherwise noted.
- Selected courses require a state-mandated end-of-course test (EOCT), as noted.

# Gwinnett County Online Campus 2007 Summer Semester

The online summer session is five weeks long and allows students to take courses to get ahead or to make-up a class previously failed. Online courses allow students to work at the time of day in which they learn the best and that best fits their schedule. Although the courses offer flexibility, they are not self-paced. Students have teacher-directed deadlines, due dates, and examinations. **Your counselor will review your choices after you submit your summer school selections online.** See the frequently asked questions and answers below and a list of course offerings on the other side of this flyer. **For additional questions, ask your counselor or see the website.**

## Frequently Asked Questions About Gwinnett County Online Campus

### What is the cost of an Online Campus course?

Each online course costs \$300.

### How do I register and pay for online classes?

Register online at [www.gwinnettk12online.net](http://www.gwinnettk12online.net) between **May 1 and June 6**. Online Campus accepts payment by credit card (VISA/Mastercard) and debit card only. **Note:** Online Campus does NOT accept cash or personal checks. **All registration is handled online.**

### What are the important dates for the Online Campus summer session?

- May 1–June 6** Online registration
- May 17, May 23 or June 4** Information sessions, 6:30 p.m., Online Campus, Buchanan HS of Technology, Bldg. E, 2595 Beaver Run Rd., Norcross
- June 11** Materials pick-up is required for some courses, between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m., Buchanan HS of Technology. *Check website under “First Day of Class” for courses requiring materials pick-up.*
- June 12** FIRST DAY OF CLASS/Online vClass Session/Chat on your home computer. *Check your course announcements for specific time.*
- June 12** Open Lab, noon–6 p.m. *(for students who need technical assistance with any of the course tools, such as uploading homework, document sharing, taking tests/quizzes, etc.)*
- June 13** Open Lab, 10 a.m.–6 p.m.
- June 13** First science lab *(Check website under “First Day of Class” for details.)*
- June 14** Open Lab, 10 a.m.–2 p.m.
- July 4** Holiday
- July 9–12** State’s End-of-Course Tests (EOCTs) window, selected courses\*
- July 14** Final Exams\*

*\*Check website and/or your course announcements for date and time. Final exams and EOCTs will be administered in a face-to-face meeting with your teacher at Buchanan HS of Technology.*

### Do I have to log-in to my course every day?

Yes, you must have daily access to a reliable computer with an Internet connection to log-in to your course. You will need to log-in each day during the school week (Monday-Friday) during the

entire summer session. An online course requires 15–20 hours a week per course during the shorter, more intensive summer classes.

### How many online courses can I take at one time?

Online Campus allows students to take no more than two courses during the summer, including any face-to-face summer school classes. Online Campus does NOT allow students to take a full unit of any course when the first semester is a prerequisite for the second.

### What is an online class like?

An online class is similar to a face-to-face class in the following ways. There is a teacher. You have lessons. You have homework, due dates, class discussion, and tests. The difference is that these activities occur over the Internet and students may “attend” class at any time of the day. However, you are required to log-in to class daily during the school week (Monday-Friday) for the entire session. (Note: July 4 is a holiday.)

### What is the structure of a course?

You will be required to attend an online vClass Session/Chat on the first day of class (June 12) on your home computer. *This information will be in your course announcements. Your teacher also will email more information.* Essentially, vClass is a virtual first day of school. On your scheduled day, you will log-in to your vClass Session during which you will take a quiz and learn more about your online class. Failure to attend this session will result in being dropped from the course.

For most classes, the rest of your work will be conducted over the Internet. (Note: Science, health, and PE classes require face-to-face labs or activities. You’ll learn more during your vClass.) Materials pick-up (June 11) is required for some courses. Check the website under “First Day of Class” for courses requiring materials pick-up.

### What about final exams and other tests?

All classes require either a final exam or the state’s end-of-course test (EOCT). These tests are administered in a face-to-face session with your teacher. EOCTs, required by the state for selected courses, will be held July 9–12 at Buchanan HS of Technology. For all other courses, the face-to-face final exam will be administered on July 14, the last day of class, at Buchanan HS of Technology. You will return your materials on test day.
